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WILL BURY JOHN ORDOQUI

Body of Lad Drowned at Redondo Several Days Ago Is Re-

covered

John, the sixteen-year-old son of M. Ordoqui, proprietor of the Pyrenees cafe, will be buried today from the Church of Our Lady of Angels. The funeral services will be held at 10 o'clock in the morning.

John Ordoqui, who was a student in the Temple street school, was drowned at Redondo beach, June 17. The body was not recovered until Tuesday afternoon. Three sailors on a lumber schooner lying in at Redondo, saw the body floating on the water and recovered it with the aid of nets.

While simming along the pier at Redondo, the young man was suddenly taken with cramps, it is thought. The ocean was so rough and the undertow so strong, the young man had not strength enough to swim to shore. Two thousand persons saw the boy struggling with the waves. One man started out to save the boy, but the undertow caught him also. He was rescued only after great efforts on the part of some of the people on the beach, who threw him ropes and hauled him to shore.

The boy was gradually borne out into the ocean. The tide carried his lifeless body under the pier and there it remained until Tuesday, when it was seen and recovered by the sailors on the lumber schooner.

Mr. Ordoqui offered a reward for the recovery of his son's body. This reward was yesterday paid to the three sailors who recovered the body.
