

MRS. COURREGES FUNERAL HELD SATURDAY

Woman Resident of Talbert
For Years Had Suffered
For Some Time

TALBERT, Dec. 7.—The funeral of Mrs. R. Courreges was held at ten o'clock Saturday morning, at St. Joseph's Catholic church in Santa Ana, and was largely attended by friends of this community and elsewhere.

The pallbearers were all of this place with the exception of a Mr. Casso of Anaheim, they being: Chas. Ward, Frank Borchard, Robert Gisler, P. A. Isnor and Emil Lecrivain.

The interment was made in the Santa Ana cemetery.

Besides her husband Mrs. Courreges leaves two sons and three daughters.

Mrs. Courreges had been in a serious condition for some time preceding her death. A few weeks ago she went to the California Hospital, Los Angeles, to be operated upon, ostensibly for tumor, but upon the incision being made the surgeons found hardening of the liver to be the trouble instead, and an operation would not relieve it. As soon as possible Mrs. Courreges was brought home and began steadily sinking. The day before she passed away she would recognize members of the family only for a moment when they would enter her room, then lapse into a semi-unconscious condition. Death came at 11:30 Wednesday morning.
