

PIONEER SHEEPMAN OF NEVADA DIES ON COAST

J. F. Yparraguirre, a member of the firm of Yparraguirre Brothers, pioneer sheepmen of Nevada, died in San Francisco yesterday at the ripe age of seventy-three years, following a protracted illness. Mr. Yparraguirre was actively engaged in business pursuits until after he passed his seventieth year, but about two years ago his health began to fail, forcing his retirement.

Deceased was born in the Pyrenees of Europe and came to the United States with his parents when a small boy. With his three brothers, Leon, Pablo and Frank, he established the present flourishing business conducted under the name of Yparraguirre Brothers of Sweetwater, Nev. Of the four, Frank alone survives. He is now in charge of the business at Sweetwater. Mrs. Marie Garat, a sister, resides in Riverside, Cal.

Other survivors are the wife, Mrs. Marie Yparraguirre, of San Francisco, four daughters, Mrs. E. M. Gallagher of Reno; Mrs. L. L. Root, Mrs. G. C. Alvarado and Mrs. W. Gloisten of San Francisco; also Mrs. J. Yparraguirre, a sister-in-law, residing in Reno.

The funeral will be conducted in San Francisco, but relatives here have not yet been advised of the hour.
