

PIONEER OF CAPISTRANO ANSWERS CALL

A resident of California since 1878 when he located at San Juan Capistrano, Baptiste DuHart, 78, died at his home in Santa Ana late yesterday. Death was attributed to his advanced age. He was born in France.

For seven years at Capistrano he worked for a sheep raising company, then purchasing a flock of sheep with Pierre Daguerre. The partnership lasted for five years, when he became associated with D. Oyharzabal, who kept sheep for nine years.

After selling out his interest, he located in Santa Ana and purchased a ranch on McClay street which he set out to cultivate. Two years later he purchased four acres on Hickey and Baker streets, where he raised walnuts, oranges and lemons, and made his home.

He was a member of the Tustin Lemon Growers association and of the Santa Ana Walnut Growers association. He belonged to St. Joseph's Catholic Church, of Santa Ana.

He was the husband of Mrs. Marian DuHart and father of Steven DuHart, Peter DuHart, Mrs. Luther L. Crowl and Mrs. V. H. McCullough, all of Santa Ana.

Funeral services will be held Thursday at 10 a. m. from the chapel of the Smith and Tuthill Funeral home, Sixth and Broadway.
