Miss McClean was injured April
12 when an automobile and motorcycle collided at Holt-Garvey
highway and San Dimas avenue,
west of Pomona, She died at 11
p. m. Wednesday, also at Pomona
Valley Community hospital, after
an operation to amputate the left

In the case of Irigaray, the jury found that death was accidental and fixed no responsibility. Testimony showed that Irigaray's car, castbound on 5th avenue, had collided with another machine driven south on Reservoir street by Ozzle
