

John Uhalde Dies At Bakersfield

John Uhalde, sr., 78, retired sheepman of the Gardnerville area, died Sunday in Bakersfield, Calif., where he had gone from his home at Madera to visit a daughter, Mrs. Thomas Anchor-doquy.

Mr. Uhalde was born in France July 2, 1878. He came to the United States and to California in 1897. After living in California for about six years he moved to Nevada, and lived in this state from 1903 until 1951.

He retired from the sheep business and lived at 3240 Plumas St. in Reno for a number of years before he and Mrs. Uhalde moved to Madera about five years ago. He was preceded in death by Mrs. Uhalde after the couple left Reno.

He is survived by four sons, John, jr., Raymond and Ernest Uhalde of Madera, Calif., and Albert Uhalde of Mountain View, Calif.; and three daughters, Mrs. Emily Berro of Madera, Mrs. Elviro Iturvy, Lodi, Calif., and Mrs. Anchordoquy of Bakersfield. Also surviving are 23 grandchildren.

Rosary will be recited this evening in the chapel of the Madera Funeral Home at 8 p.m. A high mass will be celebrated at St. Joachim Catholic church, Madera, Wednesday at 10 a.m. Burial will be in the Calvary cemetery at Madera, with the Madera Funeral home in charge of all arrangements.
