

Nazereth Hachquet

Nazereth Hachquet, 81, a resident of Carson City, died in a Carson City hospital on Friday.

He was born Oct. 2, 1889 in Uredel, France. He came to the United States in 1907 and was engaged in the sheep business most of his life in the Carson Valley and in Elko.

Hachquet owned and operated the French Hotel in Carson City for many years, later moving to Elko where he had the Nevada Hotel.

In 1953 he moved back to Carson City and operated the Aurora Motel until his retirement in 1956.

He is survived by his widow, Veronica of Carson City; four daughters, Mrs. Ross Gold of Carson City, Mrs. Pete Brust of Elko, Mrs. William Wunderlich of Elko, and Mrs. George Turcott of Fairfax, Va.; two sons Ernest of Elko, and Albert of Freemont, Calif.; one sister, Mrs. Dominique Didart of France; 15 grandchildren and one great-grandson.

Recitation of the Rosary was held at Walton's Chapel of the Valley in Carson City Sunday.

A requiem Mass was to be celebrated at St. Theresa's Catholic Church today. Interment will be in the Catholic Cemetery in Carson City.
