

## Jean Harriet

BUFFALO — The funeral mass for Jean Harriet, 60, who died Oct. 31, 1987 at Johnson County Memorial Hospital after a long illness, will be Wednesday at 10 a.m. at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, with Fr. Bill Espenshade officiating.

A rosary will be recited Tuesday at 7 p.m. at the Adams Funeral Home.

He was born Oct. 12, 1927 in Sheridan, to Simon and Catherine Harriet and grew up and received his education in Buffalo, graduating Johnson County High School in 1945. He attended the University of Wyoming and, in 1951, joined the U.S. Army, serving in Korea as a medic during the Korean Conflict.

He returned to Buffalo after the war where he married Ann Smith on July 11, 1953. They lived in Buffalo, where they were engaged in the sheep and cattle ranching business since that time.

Mr. Harriet retired in March from the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission where he was a former vice president. He was also a member of the Elks Lodge, Big Horn Basque Club, University of Wyoming Alumni Association, Wyoming Stock Grower's

Association and Wyoming Woolgrower's Association, where he served on the executive committee.

He was also a member of the Johnson County Woolgrower's and Stockgrower's Associations and was a past president and life-member of the Buffalo V.F.W. Post. Other memberships included American Legion Post #13, Farm Bureau, Knights of Columbus, where he was past Grand Knight 3rd degree. He was also a member of the 4th degree.

In addition to his widow, he is survived by three sons, Alex, Chris and Casey; two daughters, Honey and Susan Harriet; two brothers, Prosper and Martin Harriet; an aunt, Mrs. John Iberlin; and an aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. Pete Etchemendy; three grandchildren, all of Buffalo; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was preceded in death by his parents.

Memorials to St. Joseph's Children's Home in Torrington in care of the funeral home, would be appreciated. Burial will be in Willow Grove Cemetery, with graveside rites conducted by the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion.
