In loving memory. Born December
27, 1914 in Brea, California; passed
away June 11, 1997 in West Covina,
California. Survived by his loving
family: sister, Christine Etchechury
of Industry; nephew, Larry (Karen)
Etchechury of Hacienda Heights;
nieces, Jeanette (Roy) Fanucchi and
Marlene (Nicholas) Bernal, all of
Bakersfield; 10 grand nieces and

Lawrence graduated from Puente
High School in 1934.
Went to work on a local farm until
one day after he had finished milking the cow, he set the bucket on
the fence, and walked home, thinking there's a better way to make a
living.
His father, Serafin, was working at
C.C. Stafford Mig. Co., and he got his
his first real job.
So, in February 16, 1937, he was
hired as a millhand and worked in
various positions until Arpil, 1958,
when he became foreman of the mill
and worked in that position until the
mill closed in February, 1988, but he
continued to work for the company
until his death, which was a total of
sixty years with one company.
In the meantime, he held various
positions with the City of Industry.
On September 25, 1975, he was nominated to the Planning Commission
Board. On September 20, 1979, he
was nominated to the Industry Urban Dev. Agency Board. On January
9, 1932, he was nominated to the
City of Industry Council, and held
that position until his death, making
a total of 22 years for the city.
He was also on the La Puente Valley Water Board from November 12,
1968 to the present. He was a current member of the Basque Club and
the Knights of Columbus.
