ERNEST UHALDE April 21, 1921 - September 27, 2001



Ernest peacefully passed away at the age of 80 years old on Thursday, September 27, 2001. Ernest was born in 1921 in France. He was French-Basque. He came by boat to the United States when he was 15 years old with his parents and six brothers and sisters. Ernest married Helen Saldubehere in 1951, and they were together for 50 years.

Ernest served in WWII from 1942 to 1945. For his bravery in the War, he was decorated with two bronze stars and was promoted to Tech Sergeant.

He made his home in Madera, CA, and was a well-known and very well-respected woolgrower for 40 years. He retired from the sheep business in 1989. Ernest was a member of the VFW, and American Legion; the Fresno-Basque Club; the Los Banos-Basque Club; and St. Joachims Church.

Ernest is pre-deceased by his parents, John and Mary Uhalde. He is also pre-deceased by his sister, Emily Fraslin; and brothers John, Raymond, and Albert Uhalde.
