During his time in the Marines Frank met and married the love of his life, Susan Strickler Maitia. Frank was always proud of his time served. Frank had a huge heart and a passion to give. Frank was a long time Garces supporter, sending all three of his children to Garces and feeding endless Garces football players and families throughout the years! His allegiance to Garces became well-known as he was inducted into the Garces Hall of Honor in 2017. Frank was very involved with various community organizations whether it was Bob Elias, Ducks Unlimited, Bakersfield College, East Bakersfield Progressive Club or sponsoring youth athletic teams. He fed countless meals to teams of all ages and was well-known for his generosity.
