It was at Cal that Ysabel met the love of her life, Robert (Bob) Rocco Costanza and they married at St. Anne's Catholic Church in Santa Ana in 1956. Bob and Ysabel lived in Inglewood, California where their first daughter, Catherine, was born before settling in Torrance, California.

They had two more daughters, Ann and Carol, and enjoyed years of supporting the various endeavors their girls became involved with. Ysabel was a perennial 'room mother' during elementary school years, Girl Scout Troop Leader, and faithful patron of St. James Catholic Church in Redondo Beach.
