

FRENCH COLONY HEAD DIES

Ernando Etcheverry Succumbs After Operation in San Francisco Hospital

BAKERSFIELD, Feb. 22. (Exclusive)—Effects of a major operation following a sudden illness today claimed the life of Ernando Etcheverry, 63-year-old Kern landowner and rancher and foremost member of the French colony in the Southern San Joaquin Valley. He died in the French Hospital in San Francisco and word of his death struck a shocking blow into the hearts of his family and friends here today. His body was brought to a 10-¢ cal mortician's chapel where it will lie in state pending funeral arrangements.

When 16 years of age he left his father's roof to seek his for-tune in America. He lived first with two aunts in the Los Banos dis-trict, coming to Kern in 1890, where he engaged in the sheep husiness.

He also was operator of the Pyrenees Hotel on Summer street for six years and associated in business with the late P. M. Noriega.

Since that time he has devoted himself principally to farming in the Norris district.
