Pierre Dufau Well-Known **County Rancher**

Pierre M. Dufau, 78, Oxnard, died last night in a local hospital after a brief illness, Mr. Dufau, who came to the United States as a sheepherder in 1903, became one of Ventura County's most prominent ranchers, soil conservationists, and horsemen.
