Following high school, he worked for several years on the family ranch with his father. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1941 and saw action in the South Pacific during World War II on board a hospital ship. Following the war, he returned to Buffalo and went into partnership with his father on the ranch.

On March 29, 1948, he married Charlotte Durand in Buffalo. They lived on the family ranch on Powder River southeast of Buffalo. They ranched there for the past 35 years and Mr. Irigaray was living there at the time of his
