



Domingo Daguerre, aged 32, one of the best-known residents of the southern end of the county, died at his home at El Toro yesterday as the result of pneumonia following influenza. For a number of years he has been foreman of the L. F. Moulton Company warehouse at El Toro. His father, a pioneer sheep raiser, was for years associated with L. F. Moulton in the stock business, and Domingo was born upon the ranch west of El Toro. He was well known in Santa Ana, where he was a member of the Elks' lodge.

He was a big, strong, fine-looking man of the robust, husky type, with which influenza seems throughout the epidemic to have gone especially hard. He leaves his mother and sisters living at El Toro.

The remains were sent to Los Angeles, where the funeral will be held
