

Former Housekeeper Gets Half of Estate

SAN DIEGO, May 1.—Half of the large estate of Jean Cazaurang, Escondido, California, rancher murdered in Nevada in 1929, today was awarded to his former housekeeper Mrs. Marie Lees Thomas of Los Angeles by Superior Judge Edward J. Kelly.

The estate, once estimated to be worth a million dollars, included the famed old Guejito rancho northeast of Escondido, water rights in Nevada and certain lands near Alhambra, California. The interest won today is estimated to be worth \$150,000. It is from the Alhambra lands that there is prospect of rehabilitating the estate, Mrs. Thomas said.

For 11 years the estate of Cazaurang, picturesque French sheep raiser and miner, has been in the courts.
