

## Pete Arambel

ROCK SPRINGS, Wyo.—Funeral services for Pete Arambel, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Arambel, Rock Springs ranch operators, were held at South Side Catholic church in Rock Springs at 9:30 a.m. Monday, Rev. S. A. Welch officiating. Mr. Arambel died Saturday en route to the hospital here from the family ranch in Sublette county, where he suffered fatal injuries while operating an electric post-hole digger.

Being investigated Monday by Coroner Francis Tanner of Sublette county was the story that his clothing became entangled in the gearing of the digger while he was digging postholes on the ranch, 75 miles northeast of Rock Springs. He was dragged into the machinery and so seriously mangled that he died before persons at the ranch could get him to a Rock Springs hospital.

A graduate of Rock Springs high school and Purple Heart veteran of European action in World War II, Mr. Arambel was born in Rock Springs July 24, 1925. Since his discharge from the army in 1946, he has been associated with his father in the latter's livestock interests. He was a member of Rock Springs lodge No. 624, B.P.O.E., and of the Rock Springs council, Knights of Columbus.

Besides his parents, he is survived by four brothers, John, Robert, Michael and Joseph Arambel, and two sisters, Anne Marie and Rosemary Arambel, Rock Springs.
