

Micheo-Nalder Wedding Held In Gardnerville

CARSON VALLEY, Nov. 8.—Sunday afternoon at St. Gall's Catholic church in Gardnerville, at 2 o'clock, Miss Alice Fernande Micheo and Richard H. Nalder were united in marriage, the Rev. John Bourrie officiating at the double ring ceremony.

The altar was banked with white chrysanthemums, with candles lighting the chancel where baskets of white chrysanthemums and marguerites were arranged. The reserved section of the church for the bridal party and relatives was marked by white satin ribbon and bunches of marguerites.

After the ushers, Robert Morris, Orrin Brown Jr. and Joseph Micheo Jr., seated the guests, Mrs. Brooks Parks, accompanied by Mrs. George Montrose, sang "Oh, Sacred Heart Divine."

As the wedding party entered the church, Mr. Montrose played the traditional wedding march from Lohengrin. Miss Mary Micheo, maid of honor, preceded the wedding party. She was gowned in pink lace over satin, mide ballerino length, with close fitting bodice and short sleeves, with which she wore short white gloves and pink accessories. She wore pink carnations in her hair, and her arm bouquet was of the same flowers.

Joseph Micheo, father of the bride, escorted her to the altar. The bride wore a gown of white slipper satin, made with full skirt, full train and long sleeves, with a net yoke outlined with draped satin and handmade lace, the close fitting bodice, shirred on the sides. Panels of the skirt were held in place by semi-hoops, giving a colonial effect to the gown. Her veil of imported illusion was held in place by a bandeau of white satin embroidered in seed pearls. She carried a white prayer book, with white satins streamers, to which were attached clusters of stephanotis. She wore a white gold wrist watch, a gift of the bridegroom, and a diamond pendant necklace, loaned by her aunt. For something blue, she wore a handmade garter, given to her by a friend.

Clifford Winkelman, friend of the bridegroom, was best man.

After the wedding ceremony as the couple knelt in prayer Mrs. Park sang "On This Day Oh Beautiful Mother."

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Micheo of Gardnerville. She attended the local schools and the University of Nevada where she was affiliated with Delta Delta Delta sorority. She also completed a secretarial course at the Reno Business college, and shortly after her graduation was appointed deputy clerk of the supreme court, a position she has held for two years.

The bridegroom is the son of Mrs. Irene Mitchell and the late Charles Nalder of Elko. He attended the schools there, and enlisted in the air corps, during the early part of world war II. He served overseas with the Tenth air force in India, China and Burma.
