

Rites Scheduled For Fall Victim

ELKO — Funeral services for Pete Sansinena, 75-year-old Beowawe rancher who fell to his death down an abandoned mine shaft near Beowawe Tuesday, will be held Saturday at 10 a.m. in St. Joseph's Catholic Church. Burial will be in the family plot in the Catholic Cemetery here.

Recitation of the Rosary is set this evening at eight o'clock in the Burns Funeral Home.

Mr. Sansinena was born in Urepef, France, and came to the United States as a young man, moving to the Reno area about 1905. He engaged in the sheep business several years, then went to Cedarville. In 1924 he moved to Beowawe to engage in the sheep and cattle business. He was a member of the Nevada Cattlemen's Association.

Surviving are his widow Mary Louise, whom he married in San Francisco in 1917 and who resides in Beowawe; two sons, Leon and Paul of Beowawe; two daughters, Miss Emily Sansinena of Reno and Mrs. Yvonne Smith of Beowawe; three grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.
